- Stockholm University & ETH Zurich find that <u>all rainwater on Earth unsafe to drink</u> due to 'forever' chemicals
- Biden signs <u>climate</u>, <u>tax and health bill</u> into law
- The <u>price of solar</u> electricity has dropped 89% in 10 years
- <u>Dutch Court ordered Shell</u> to cut its carbon emissions by 45% by the year 2030
- A Kenyan woman opened a <u>business converting plastic waste into sustainable materials</u>, a material stronger than concrete.
- Coral Reefs are recovering Great Barrier Reef has most coral in decades
- Reflective streets in LA are helping cool down neighborhoods, reduce emissions, and keep people healthy
- Fifth National Climate Assessment (NCA5) is underway and anticipated in 2023




